Impacts on Career: There are 25% more workers than previously estimated potentially needing to switch occupations⁴

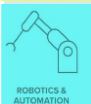
E-Commerce: US E-commerce has grown 3x faster than before the pandemic⁵

Digital Payment: 82% of Americans have used digital payments in 2021⁶

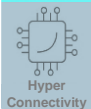
The Impact of a New Economy

30% of jobs are at risk of being supplanted by automation by the mid-2030's⁸

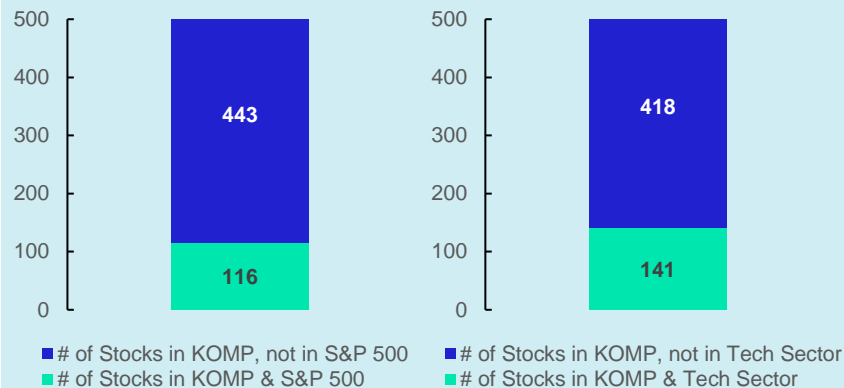


The Internet of Thing is estimated to unlock **\$5.5 - \$12.6 trillion in economic value** globally by 2030⁹

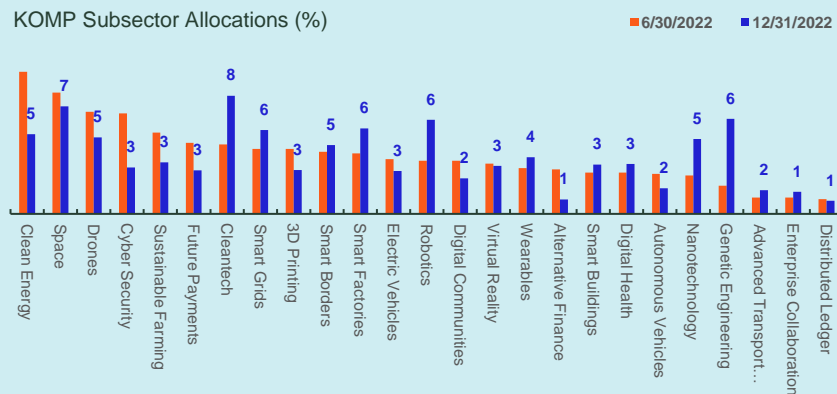


Biological innovations could have a direct economic impact between **\$2 to \$4 trillion per year** by 2035¹⁰
